Trends in performance / comments from checklists / global ratings indicate:

- Demonstrated excellent performance in one five-minute couplet station (Station 1/2).
- Demonstrated good performance on one five-minute couplet station (Station 13/14), in the clinical encounter of two five-minute couplet stations (Stations 7C, 9C) and in the written component of one five-minute couplet station (Station 6C).
- Consistently treated clients with dignity and respect.
- Consistently demonstrated effective non-verbal communication.
- Consistently demonstrated appropriate listening skills.
- Frequently demonstrated an organized approach in clinical encounters.
- Frequently demonstrated appropriate techniques in clinical encounters.
- Frequently demonstrated use of concise and understandable language.

Date:

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- Demonstrated inadequate knowledge and/or provided misinformation in one station (Station 8T).

Comments noted by examiners included:

- Good explanation to the client; demonstrated technique repeatedly until client was able to perform correctly; good performance (Station 4T).
- Demonstrated good listening skills; corrected the client's technique after incorrect performance (Station 5T).
- Did not pay sufficient attention to safety precautions (Station 7T).

Comments noted by examiners (continued):

- Did not gather sufficient information from client during history taking (Station 8T).
- Attempted an inappropriate exercise with client; subsequently advised client not to perform this exercise (Station 9C).

In reviewing the stations that you failed, the following were noted:

- Precautions of treatment were absent or completed incorrectly in one station (Station 7T).
- Key components of history taking were not demonstrated or were completed incorrectly in one station (Station 8T).
- Key components of physical assessment were not demonstrated or were completed incorrectly in one station (Station 1T).
- Key physical techniques were not demonstrated or were completed incorrectly in one station (Station 15C).
- Key components of instructions to client (for performance of techniques in the station) were absent or completed incorrectly in three stations (Stations 3T, 5T, 15C).
- Components of client self care education (for self-management of the condition) were absent or completed incorrectly in two stations (Stations 3T, 15C).
